## **From the Office of the Provincial**





### My Dear Confreres,

The Latin root for the word compassion is pati, which means to suffer; the prefix com means with. Compassion, originating from compati, literally means to suffer with. The connection of suffering with another person brings compassion beyond sympathy into the realm

of empathy. The Bible doesn't explain compassion like a dictionary does, simply telling us what the word means. Instead, the Bible defines compassion by showing us what compassion looks like and what is involved with being compassionate. It is in this context that we the Fransalians reflect and cogitate on the Seven Sorrows that Mother Mary had to go through because of her intimate relationship with Jesus. It is important for us to understand that like the Sorrowful Mysteries of the rosary, the Seven Sorrows highlight certain moments from Mary's life that are painful, precisely because of her deep love for Jesus. Sometimes we think of Mary as the celestial Queen of Heaven; sinless, perfect in every way, far above every normal human experience. She can be seen to represent a holiness so unattainable that we hardly dare try to be like her. The Sorrows by contrast, present her in her profound humanity, in relationship with the very human Jesus, her own Son. When we imagine her thoughts and feelings coming out of these moments with Christ, we are invited to see Him with her, with a deeply rooted human love. We are moved to compassion for both of them. Such a practice then invites us to experience graced compassion for our fellow humans. By love for our neighbour we are led to love God, and then are back again.

"I end my letter in asking you dear Missionaries, to imitate the Holy Trinity, that all may be one - that they may be one as we are one." (Letter to Fr. Cheminal, 10-06-1843; pgs. 35-36) "You will remain perfectly united, at all times showing a warm and cordial regard for one another like brothers who love each other and possess true zeal of Jesus Christ and of Saint Francis de Sales our glorious and illustrious patron, and who wish to seek nothing else but the

greater glory of God, the salvation of souls as well as their own salvation." (Letter to the MSFS of La Feuillette, 20-09-1842; pg. 36) The above extract is from the letters of Fr. Mermier our beloved Founder who exhorts us to keep the Holy Trinity as a role model for our religious and apostolic life. As we prepare ourselves to celebrate Founder's Day let us all be inspired and guided by his missionary zeal to work unitedly for the greater glory of God. ### **Theme Paper for The Provincial Chapter 2023**

The theme of the Provincial Chapter is "LIVE AND BE A VISIBLE SIGN OF OUR CHARISM". An orientation paper on the above theme with a questionnaire will help the Province to focus on various aspects of our life, mission and ministry as to how we are called upon to live and be a visible sign of our charism to the world. The paper will help the members to understand the theme and its relevance and provide deeper knowledge and understanding of our Charism. Members are encouraged to study, assess and evaluate our Province in the light of the study paper so that as a Province we all have a deeper knowledge of our Charism which will further lead us to live it in our life meaningfully. The Conveners of the Apostolic Communities will call for a common meeting, prepare a report and send the soft copy to the Provincial Secretary. They should plan well in advance and encourage all the members to be present for this important meeting. The soft copy of the approach paper and the questionnaire will be dispatched shortly to the Superiors of the Local Communities, who will supply hard copies to the members of the community.

### **Appointment of the Steering Committee**

Some of the members of the Nagpur Apostolic Community are appointed as members of the Steering Committee to oversee the planning and preparation for the Provincial Chapter 2023. The Steering Committee will have its meeting within a fortnight to finalize the program. Various duties will be assigned to the members to ensure a successful Provincial Chapter.

### Participants of the Chapter - 2023

The participants of the Provincial Chapter are comprised of ex-officio members and elected delegates with the right to vote. (Const. 237) The ex-officio members are the out-going Provincial Administration, Rectors of Formation Houses, the Director of Novices, and Delegation Superiors of Germany and Mozambique. There will be two representatives from the Scholastics. For the election of delegates, all the confreres in India are divided into four Electoral Colleges, clubbing different Apostolic Communities. Each Electoral College will vote to elect delegates from their group. Mozambique mission will have one delegate besides the Delegation Superior. In the





election of delegates to the Provincial Chapter, the ex-officio members of the Chapter are not allowed to vote. To be elected as a delegate to the Chapter one should get absolute majority in the first ballot. If the result is inconclusive then there will be a second ballot for which only a relative majority is required. The process of elections will be done through E-Voting and the details of it will be communicated to the eligible members by mail. The E-Voting/ballot paper voting process will begin soon after the Feast of Our Lady of Compassion. I solicit your cooperation and support in completing the process of election to decide the Delegates of the Chapter. A committee consisting of Fr. Jnanamani, Fr. Vishwas Torne and Fr. Sylvester Xalxo is appointed to oversee the election of the Delegates for the Provincial Chapter 2023.





On 20<sup>th</sup> July 1835, Fr. Mermier requested Bishop Rey to obtain permission from Rome for a long period (literally for an unlimited time) to bless the scapulars of Our Lady of Compassion. On 19<sup>th</sup> April 1843, Fr. Mermier instructed the confreres at Notre Dame de la Gorge to conduct devotions in honour of Our Lady of Compassion every Friday and a Novena in preparation for one the feasts of our Lady of Compassion.
