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## From the Office of the Provincial

**My Dear Confreres,**

With the celebration of the Solemnity of Christ the King, the ordinary time of the liturgical year comes to an end. We begin the Advent season and the Church exhorts us to prepare ourselves for a special feast; i.e. Christmas. So this season holds great significance in the liturgical calendar, as it marks the beginning of the new liturgical year and serves as a time of preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ. The four weeks leading up to Christmas are rich with symbolism and spiritual themes.

**Candles:** The Advent wreath, typically adorned with four candles placed in our churches and chapels, symbolizes the four weeks of preparation. Each candle represents a specific virtue: hope, peace, joy, and love. Lighting these candles every Sunday helps to focus on these virtues.

**Anticipation and Reflection:** Advent is a period of expectation, mirroring the anticipation of the arrival of the Messiah. We are called to use this time for reflection, examining our lives in light of our Christian and Religious spiritual principles, and renewing our commitment to living our faith.

**Scripture and Prayer:** Reading relevant scriptural passages and engaging in prayer are central to Advent. It allows us to delve into the Biblical narratives or descriptions surrounding the Birth of Jesus, and fosters a deeper connection with the spiritual aspects of the season.

**Acts of Kindness:** Advent season encourages us to practice kindness and generosity. Acts of charity and goodwill towards others become tangible expressions of the love and joy associated with Christmas.

**Sacrament of Reconciliation:** This season particularly invites us to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation; i.e. making a good confession, thus seeking spiritual purification and renewal, as we prepare to celebrate the Birth of Jesus.

Dear confreres, in short, the significance of Advent season lies in the intentional and reflective approach to preparing one's heart and mind for the celebration of Christmas. At every Christmas we are reminded to celebrate the mystery of God's love. **"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."** (Jn 4/16) In essence, celebrating the mystery of God's love at Christmas is a spiritual and meaningful observance that goes beyond the festive traditions. It calls for a contemplative reflection on the profound love of God as revealed in the Birth of Jesus and inspires all of us to live out that love in our own lives. Let us then make conscious efforts to spend time in prayer and reflection, so that we prepare ourselves spiritually to celebrate the Birth of Jesus in a more worthy manner.





# Provincial Chapter 2023

## STATEMENT



We, the participants of the Provincial Chapter of Nagpur Province of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales, gathered at the MSFS Provincialate, Nagpur for the Ordinary Provincial Chapter from 09th to 13th November 2023. We are very grateful to the Extraordinary General Chapter 2022 of our Congregation for having redefined clearly and precisely the meaning of the Charism of our Congregation: Our Charism is to continue the mission of Christ and His Church by living the spirit and spirituality of St. Francis de Sales in a religious community of missionaries, as lived and envisioned by our Founder. We realize, our apostolates are not our Charism. It is our Charism, the vital source, that makes our apostolates Fransalian. Our Charism is the soul of all our apostolates.

We, prayerfully reflected on the theme, “Live and Be a Visible Sign of Our Charism” and on the collated reports of the Apostolic Communities, and other reports presented in the Chapter, have arrived at the following conclusions:

### **1. Personal and Community life**

We live our Charism of community living, Fransalian and missionary identity, as persons and as communities. We resolve to be the salt and light of the earth with authenticity and sincerity. Each one of us will continue to strive to live in fraternal communion; by being compassionate, gentle, simple, reaching out with generosity, in the merciful mission of the Lord.

### **2. Apostolate of Education**

Despite all the challenges, we will strive diligently to educate the children and youth, giving witness in imparting the love of Jesus with our resourcefulness, tenderness and





firmness, holding aloft hope for a better human and humane world. The future of the earth depends on the care of environment and its sustainability. We are committed as educators to inspire and encourage our students to care for mother earth. Thus, we will be a visible sign of our Charism in education.

### **3. Apostolate of Mission**

Our Congregation was born in the context of Fr. Mermier renewing the faith of the people of Chatelard. We commit ourselves to revive Parish Mission Preaching (PMP) and other forms of renewal in our highly secularised world. We shall 'Live Jesus' and be good shepherds of His sheep wherever we are sent. We are resolved to strengthen our Mozambique Delegation into a more effective and self-reliant unit in our Congregation. We shall exercise our priestly ministry with grace and power in a synodal way. Thus, we will be a visible sign of our Charism in our mission.

### **4. Apostolate of Formation**

Formation of our members is a priority to understand and live our Charism. We resolve to promote good and genuine vocations through focused efforts in vocation promotion and accompanying them in the Fransalian way, to be effective and integrated missionaries. Education of the formators is of paramount importance. We are committed to equip our formators with the knowledge, skills and dispositions needed to accompany the formees. To be effective and relevant, we will periodically organise ongoing formation programmes for our confreres. Thus, we will be a visible sign of our Charism in our formation.

### **5. Apostolate of SAIM (Social Apostolate and Innovative Ministries)**

Social Apostolate and Innovative Ministries are integral part of the mission of the Lord. We will identify, coordinate and strengthen innovative ways in which our communities respond to the social needs of the people. At the same time, we will evolve a structured approach of the Registered Societies to galvanise social work apostolate in our Province. We also resolve to use all the temporal goods of the Province by being more transparent and accountable to share the resources with the people in need. Thus, we will be a visible sign of our Charism in our Social Apostolate and Innovative Ministries. By living our Charism authentically God will infuse our apostolates with divine grace and make us visible signs as Fransalians.

## **ACTION PLAN**

### **PERSONAL AND COMMUNITY LIFE**

- 1) Each of us shall make special effort to be regular and punctual for all the spiritual exercises and community activities.
- 2) We shall keep away all electronic gadgets during the community prayers and meals.
- 3) Every community shall display the Charism statement in a prominent place.

- 4) We shall live our fraternal communion with compassion, gentleness, simplicity and by reaching out to each other.

## **MISSION**

- 1) Without any exemption, we shall send all the newly ordained priests to the missions at least for the first two years.
- 2) All the required parish registers shall be kept ready for the Provincial or Councillor In-charge of Mission to check during the visits.
- 3) As far as possible new mission stations shall be taken up, particularly in Ambikapur, Dumka and Simdega Dioceses.
- 4) All our parishes without fail shall start Basic Ecclesial Community (BEC) or its equivalent.
- 5) Special care shall be taken to keep the places of worship clean and tidy; and observe the decorum as expected by the liturgical norms.

## **FORMATION**

- 1) We shall equip our formators by sending them for nine months formation course.
- 2) We shall appoint more regional vocation promoters whose work will be co-ordinated by the Councillor In-charge of Formation.
- 3) The Councillor In-charge of Formation shall find the modalities of improving the students' proficiency in English and Hindi and implement them.
- 4) We shall establish language labs in all our minor seminaries.
- 5) The Councillor In-charge of Formation shall take extra care to continue to organize ongoing formation.
- 6) The Councillor In-charge of Formation shall explore the possibility of bringing the professed scholastics together in the Province once in two years.

## **EDUCATION**

- 1) Every year, two confreres shall be sent for regular B.Ed., who are proficient in language and who have good academic background.
- 2) We shall appoint a committee for professional evaluation of our educational institutions.
- 3) Before appointing a confrere as office administrator, he shall be provided with professional training.
- 4) The Councillor In-charge of Education shall make sure of the implementation of the Code of Ethics/Conduct in all our educational institutions.

## **SOCIAL APOSTOLATE AND INNOVATIVE MINISTRIES**

- 1) We shall initiate and promote Fransalian Associates in our Province.
- 2) MDO shall coordinate the social projects in all our missions.
- 3) Cause of our Founder shall be enthusiastically promoted.
- 4) We shall explore the possibility of starting a retreat and animation centre.
- 5) We shall continue to organise youth gatherings once a year in our parishes and once in three years at the Province level.



## STEWARDSHIP

- 1) Local bursars shall be taught account keeping and related programmes like Tally.
- 2) All the mission units shall enhance their resource mobilisation by raising local funds.
- 3) Tabling of the accounts shall be done at the monthly community meetings.
- 4) Provincial Bursar shall monitor all the Societies/Trusts with regard to keeping the minutes and updating Schedule-I.
- 5) Just salaries and all needed emoluments shall be paid to all our employees.

## MOZAMBIQUE DELEGATION

We reaffirm our commitment to support our MSFS Mission in Mozambique.

- 1) We shall strengthen our MSFS Mission in Mozambique with regard to finance and personnel.
- 2) Three confreres from Mozambique shall be sent for higher studies during the next five years.
- 3) A well-equipped minor seminary shall be constructed in Mozambique.

## National Annual PMP Gathering at Nagpur

The Parish Mission Preaching Teams from all the Indian Provinces had the annual gathering in the MSFS Provincialate, Nagpur from 23rd to 26th October 2023. Rev. Fr. Johnson Kallidukil, the General Secretary in charge of Missions very meticulously organized the program of three days. Only 29 participants from the 7 Indian Provinces took part in the programme, though 35 were supposed to attend. Fr. Melroy Almeida, Fr. Peter Dominic, Fr. Telesfor Lakra, Fr. Sandeep Tirkey, Fr. Lalit Tigga and Fr. K.V. Joseph of Nagpur Province, participated in the programme. Most of the participants had reached the Provincialate on 23/10/23. As some of the participants could not reach on the 23rd we had to reschedule the inaugural session to the following day. On 24/10/23 the session began with the lighting of the lamp by the Provincial, Fr. Manoj Tirkey, the Assistant General and the General Secretary for Mission, Fr. Johnson Kallidikkal, and the resource person Rev. Sr. Elsy. Fr. Manoj Tirkey, the Provincial in his welcome speech, briefed us on the origin of Parish Mission Preaching, on Fr. Peter Mermier's role in this mission during his time, and its relevance today. The dignitaries and all the participants from each province were welcomed with a shawl and a flower by Fr. Manoj. Each confrere came forward and introduced himself as he was welcomed. This was followed by a very encouraging voice message from our Superior General, Rev. Fr. Abraham. The inaugural session concluded with the introducing and welcoming of the resource person Rev. Sr. Elsy by Fr. Johnson Kallidukil. On the 24th and 25th the resource person Sr. Elsy

guided the PMP team members by meaningful talks and exercises on the Charisms, i.e. the Fruits and Gifts of the Holy Spirit. We the preachers of God's Word were made aware of the power and the value of the priesthood that each one has been blessed with. The Holy Hour, Meditations, various prayers of the day, the practical spiritual exercises and the Holy Eucharist on these prayer days helped us to get energised in the Holy Spirit to continue the PMP ministry in a powerful way. On 26th for two sessions the coordinators of the Provinces shared about the PMP ministry in their Provinces. The programme also included a short visit to Kamptee Mission, Seminary Hills Cemetery and to the SMMI Provincialate, where a museum of their Founder, Mother Gertrude is prepared with her personal items. The Provincial, Fr. Manoj Tirkey, the Superior of the community Fr. Sylbester Xalxo and all the community members of the Provincialate were thanked for their wonderful hospitality. The PMP National Gathering was well organised and the members were very happy to have had the program in Nagpur, a historical place of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales.

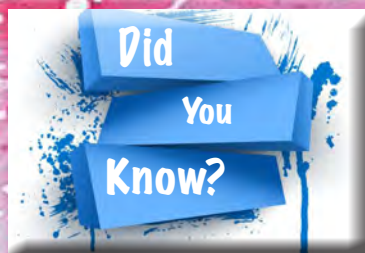
