“Christmas is God’s eternal love entering human history in silence, humility, and tenderness.”

Dear Confreres,

As we celebrate Christmas with great fervour and joy, the Church invites us not merely to remember an event of the past, but to enter into a living mystery that continues to unfold in every age. Christmas celebrates the astonishing truth that God chose to become one of us, embracing our human condition in its fragility and vulnerability. In a world marked today by rapid change, uncertainty, conflict, and growing restlessness, the proclamation of Christmas remains ever new: **“The Word became flesh and dwelt among us” (Jn. 1:14)**. God does not remain distant, but draws near, choosing the path of humility and simplicity rather than power and spectacle.



For us as Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales, the mystery of the Incarnation holds a special place in our spirituality. St. Francis de Sales contemplated Christmas as the supreme revelation of God’s gentle and loving heart. He reminds us that the eternal Father sent His Son into the world not as a judge, but as a little Child, full of mercy and tenderness. In the Infant of Bethlehem, we discover a God who conquers hearts not through force but through love, inviting us to live our vocation in meekness, patience, and humility. Christmas, therefore, calls us anew to embrace the Salesian spirit of gentleness in our relationships, pastoral ministry, and community life.

The significance of Christmas today lies also in its challenge to us as religious and priests. The celebration of Christ’s birth urges us to ask ourselves whether we still allow the Lord to be born daily in our own hearts. The mystery of the Incarnation reminds us that God desires to dwell not only in a manger long ago, but in our lives, our fraternities, and our mission. As the Church teaches, by becoming man, Christ united Himself with every human person (cf. *Gaudium et Spes*, 22). To celebrate Christmas authentically, then, is to draw closer to people, especially the poor, the forgotten, and the wounded, making our presence among them a living sign of Emmanuel, God-with-us.

Christmas is also a renewed call to mission. The Child laid in a manger sends us forth to carry His peace, hope, and compassion into a world often torn by division and despair. St. Francis de Sales gently exhorts us that the measure of love is to love without measure. If Christ has humbled Himself to dwell among us, we too are called to manifest His love through kindness of speech, patience in service, and a merciful heart in our pastoral ministry. In a fractured society, our simple gestures of understanding and accompaniment can become powerful witnesses of the Gospel.

As we celebrate the mystery of the Nativity, let us remember that Bethlehem is not merely a place of the past, nor is the manger only a historical symbol. Christmas becomes real whenever Christ is welcomed anew in our hearts and allowed to shape our lives. May this holy feast rekindle in us the joy of our vocation, deepen our fraternity, and strengthen our resolve to live the Gospel with humility and gentleness. May the Child of Bethlehem be born anew in each of us, so that through our lives and mission, the world may truly encounter Emmanuel, God-with-us.

Wishing you all a deeply blessed and grace-filled Christmas and a Happy New Year 2026.

FORMATION FORUM MEETING 2025

The Formation Forum Meeting was held on **1st and 2nd December 2025** at the MSFS Provincialate, Nagpur. Rev. Fr. Sandeep Tirkey MSFS Provincial Councilor for Formation formally extended a hearty welcome to the Resource person Rev. Fr. Shiju Francis O.P, Rev. Fr. Manoj Tirkey MSFS, Provincial Superior of Nagpur Province, and Rev. Fr. Benedict D'Souza MSFS, General Councilor for Formation. He also extended a warm welcome to the formation forum members.

Fr. Shiju Francis O.P. presented the theme **“Present Challenges of Formation of Religious Candidates for Priesthood.”**

He highlighted the following points:

- Formators are builders of divine relationship. Being formators is a great sacrifice and a herculean task. Understanding, constant accompaniment and motivational force can help formees to overcome their human, personal, emotional, psycho-sexual behaviors, socio-spiritual constraints and bondages.

- The present generation of formees are not looking for role models but for formators and their witnessing life messages.
- Digital distractions are rising high. Such advancing technology cannot be avoided, but should be used responsibly for the sake of safety, security and evangelization. One should not become a victim or an addict.
- Practical strategies need to be implemented for normalizing human impulses and responsibly handling of situations.
- Fr. Roshan Tigga proposed the vote of thanks to the Resource Person.

The second part of the meeting was addressed by Rev. Fr. Benedict D'Souza MSFS General Councilor for Formation. In his opening note, he conveyed greetings of the Superior General and his curia members.

He sharing highlighted on personal sanctity, prayer life, loyalty to the Congregation, accompaniment of formees on their journey of life, especially the brothers of Nagpur Province studying in Suvidya College, Bangalore. Then each formation house presented its report. Based on the reports some insights and feedback were given by the forum members.

The Provincial welcomed and thanked Fr. Benedict D'Souza, the General Councilor for Formation and Fr. Issac for their very presence and guidance. He also appreciated and thanked Fr. Sandeep Tirkey Provincial Councilor for Formation, for the systematic arrangements and the good organization of the Formation Forum Meeting. He thanked all the participants for their presence and active participation.

In his address he emphasized that it is not every one's cup of tea to be a formator. Formation is a fundamental principle for our mission and it is a tedious and a priceless job. Accompanying, motivating and entering in the real world of formees, knowing their background, attitude, aptitude and emotional progress lies in the exemplary life of the formators. He recalled the resource person's words. "Formation is not taught but caught". When we are able to nurture spiritual formation, personalized formation, human and pastoral formation well, then we can make our communities healthy communities. The well-being of formees is most important as "we cannot build a spiritual foundation on a broken foundation"

Emotional formation is very important and we need to pay more attention to it. Suicidal tendencies are at a high risk now a days. We need to make formees capable enough to express and share their joy and pain. Collection of all the documents of formees is a must to be on the safer side. Accompaniment of formees and constant guidance and providing ample opportunities to excel in their interested areas will make them for future mission as well.

The meeting ended with the vote of thanks by Fr. Roshan Tigga.

REGENT'S MEET 2025-26

The Regents' Meet was held on **3rd and 4th of December**. Ten regents were present. It offered a meaningful opportunity to pause, reflect, and renew oneself in the spirit and vision of Jesus Christ.

Day 1:

The programme commenced with the celebration of the Holy Eucharist. It was presided over by Fr. Sandeep Tirkey, Provincial Councillor in charge of Formation. At 9:15 a.m., the formal welcoming and felicitation of the resource persons, Fr. Thomas Kuttiankal, Fr. Manoj Tirkey, Provincial Superior, and Fr. It began with the celebration of the Holy Eucharist by Fr. Manoj Tirkey.



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First session: It began at 9.00 am. In his sharing Fr. Manoj thanked the participants. He said that every small step we take is the beginning of greater things. He also said that we must always respect the laws of the land, the local norms and community spirit where we work, to avoid any misunderstanding with the people. Secondly, accountability is most essential especially to our donors; need to be genuine and transparent. He also assured the support of the Provincial Administration to any initiatives in social ministry. Update about Ambad mission was shared and its scope. He also mentioned about the works of MDO. Need to train priests to take up tasks more effectively focusing on education of children, animation of youth, skill development and training. There is a proposal for a media centre in Nagpur or Latapara. The sharing ended by 10.00 am.
