

Dear Confreres,

Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

With hearts filled with joy and gratitude, we celebrate the glorious feast of Easter—the very heart of our Christian faith and the radiant summit of the Church's liturgical year. The resurrection of Christ is not merely an event in history; it is the living power that continues to renew the Church and our personal lives. In His victory over sin and death, we discover the unshakable foundation of our hope and the assurance that life has triumphed over darkness. The empty tomb is not just a symbol of Christ's resurrection—it is an invitation to each of us. An invitation to rise with Him, to leave behind everything that binds us to despair, fear, complacency, or indifference. This year, our Easter celebration is especially enriched as we continue our spiritual journey toward the Jubilee Year 2025, proclaimed by Pope Francis under the theme "Pilgrims of Hope." Each time we celebrate the Eucharist, we are not only commemorating but participating in the Paschal Mystery. It nourishes us, transforms us, and sends us forth to be bread broken for others. Let us be priests and religious who live Eucharistically - who live lives of thanksgiving, self-giving, and communion.

Dear confreres, may this Easter be a true spiritual springtime for each of us. May the light of the Risen Christ illumine our path as we move forward as pilgrims of hope - as brothers bound by faith, service, and love. May our communities radiate the peace of Easter, becoming oases of compassion and courage, where the suffering find solace and the searching find direction.

Let us carry the Easter Alleluia not just on our lips but in every action, every gesture of kindness, every moment of reconciliation, and every effort to bring hope to others. In doing so, we become the Easter people the world longs for—bearers of life in a world too often overshadowed by death.

Wishing you all a Blessed and Joy-filled Easter!

May the Risen Lord fill your hearts, communities, and mission with His peace, power, and presence. Live Jesus!

From **February 21 to March 15, 2025,** I visited Germany, France, and Rome to strengthen our pastoral connections and assess our missionary engagements. This journey offered deep insights into evangelization in Europe amidst growing secularization and declining church attendance.

Germany: Challenges and Commitment

In Germany, I attended the blessing of the Mariahilf Shrine in Regensburg, a significant initiative to revive the faith. The solemn event saw the participation of MSFS priests, religious sisters, and a large gathering of faithful. The decline in Church attendance remains a major challenge, with grand Churches turning into tourist attractions rather than centres of worship. The younger generation shows little interest in religious life.

I met our MSFS confreres serving in the Dioceses of Regensburg and Bamberg, where they manage multiple parishes with limited support. Their dedication, particularly in ministering to the sick and elderly, was deeply appreciated by the Diocesan authorities. Despite challenges, our missionaries remain committed to their pastoral responsibilities, offering hope for spiritual renewal.

France: Rediscovering Our Fransalian Heritage

In Annecy, under the guidance of Rev. Fr. Samuel Devraj MSFS, I walked in the footsteps of St. Francis de Sales, visiting his birthplace, sites of his ordination, and the Cathedral where he was consecrated. A highlight was celebrating Mass in the Cathedral where he was ordained a Bishop. I also had the rare opportunity to pray near his tomb alongside those of St. Jane de Chantal and Fr. Peter Mary Mermier, a spiritually enriching experience.

A pilgrimage to Ars, the shrine of St. John Mary Vianney, was another profound moment. Celebrating Mass at his tomb deepened my appreci-



ation for priestly ministry and holiness. The meticulous hospitality of our confreres in France, Fr. Aneesh Devasikutty MSFS and Fr. Bipin Xess MSFS, made this pilgrimage even more meaningful.

Rome: A Deep Spiritual Encounter

On March 12, 2025, I arrived in Rome and was warmly received at Fiumicino Airport by Fr. Jose Cheriyanthara. After dinner, he took me for a walk to St. Peter's Square. It was an awe-inspiring sight, radiating the deep spiritual and historical significance of the Catholic Church. The following morning, I had the privilege of concelebrating Mass at St. Peter's Basilica, standing at the heart of our faith and in the footsteps of the Apostles. This sacred experience was followed by a visit to the ancient city of Rome, where history and modernity blend seamlessly. Walking through its preserved monuments and vibrant streets deepened my appreciation for the Universal Church. A significant part of my stay was the visit to our new MSFS Generalate, about an hour's drive from the city. It was an inspiring moment that reaffirmed the importance of our global mission and the need for visionary leadership to shape our Congregation's future.

This journey highlighted both the challenges and opportunities of our missionary presence in Europe. While secularization threatens faith engagement, the commitment of our confreres remains a ray of hope. Our mission calls for renewed zeal in evangelization, pastoral care, and Gospel witness. Let us continue to pray for the Church and for strength to serve with faith and perseverance.

DEACON LONA CHRISTIAN AROGYASWAMY MSFS

Deacon Lona Christian Arogyaswamy MSFS, was born on 5th January 1996 in a devout Catholic family in Palakkad, Kerala, India. He is the youngest of the three children of Mr. Arogyaswamy and Mrs. Pushpam. He was baptized on 11th February 1996 at St. James' Church, Sayathurai. He received his First Holy Communion and the Sacrament of Confirmation on 7th May 2006 at St. Thomas Forane Church, Puthur.



His early education from 2002-05 was at St. Xavier's School, Parisakkal. His Upper Primary School from 2005-09 was at VHSSC, Puthur, and High School from 2009-12 was at VHSSC, Kozhipara. Having a strong desire to become a religious priest, he joined the Congregation of the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales in 2012, beginning his seminary formation at Prakash Bhavan, Palakkad. He did his Higher Secondary Education from 2013-15 at G.H.S.C. Pottassery.

He did his novitiate at Dhyanashram, Varanasi from 2015-16, and made his First Profession on 31st May 2016. Desiring to render his service in Africa he opted to work in Mozambique. He pursued his Philosophical Studies at Lumen Christi Institute, Maji ya Chai, Arusha, Tanzania from 2016-19. He did his regency at Casa Fransaliana, Matola, Mozambique. Having learned Portuguese during his regency, he joined Lar Mermier Study House, Maputo and did his studies in Theology at the Seminário Teológico Interdiocesano São Pio X, Maputo from 2021-24.

Dn. Lona made his Perpetual Profession on 23rd November 2024. He was ordained a Deacon on 24th November 2024 at the Santuário de Nossa Senhora de Fátima, Muliquela by His Lordship Dom Inácio Lucas, Bishop of Gurúè. **He will be ordained a priest on 1st May 2025,** at St. Sebastian's Cathedral, Sultanpet, Palakkad, Kerala.

DEACON EGÍDIO ABEL MSFS



Deacon Egídio Abel MSFS was born on September 16th 1992, into a devout Catholic family in Monapo, Nampula Province, Mozambique. He is the fourth of seven children born to Late Mr. Abel João and Mrs. Joaquina Saguina. He was baptized on June 20th 1993, received his First Holy Communion on April 20th 2006, and was confirmed on December 12th 2009 at Paróquia de Nossa Senhora da Assunção de Netia. He did his primary education at Caviria Primary School from 2000-06, and his secondary and higher secondary education at Namialo Secondary School from 2007-11.

He decided to join the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales and began his initial formation in 2012 at Casa Fransaliana, Matola. In 2013, he was sent to Ndagani, Kenya, for his pre-novitiate program. He made his First Profession on July 10th 2015, at the MSFS Novitiate, Kibaha, Tanzania. From 2015-18 he did his studies in Philosophy at Lumen Christi Institute in Arusha, Tanzania. He did his regency at St. Anthony's Parish, Mavila, Inhambane, Mozambique. He joined Lar Mermier Scholasticate, Maputo and did his studies in Theology at the Interdiocesan Major Seminary São Pio X from 2020-24.

He made his Perpetual Profession on November 23rd 2024. He was ordained a Deacon on November 24th 2024, at the Santuário de Nossa Senhora de Fátima, Muliquela, by His Lordship Dom Inácio Lucas, Bishop of Gurúè. **He will be ordained a priest on May 31st 2025,** at the Parish of Nossa Senhora das Mercês, Katembe, Mozambique.

TU ES SACERDOS IN AETERNUM – THOU ART A PRIEST FOREVER



It was indeed a big surprise for all when it was officially announced by Bishop Bernard Lancy Pinto, the Bishop of Aurangabad Diocese, that this year's Chrism Mass will be held at St. Mary's Church, Jalna. On being contacted by the Bishop for this purpose Fr. Melroy Almeida readily said 'Yes' taking up the responsibility to host and organize this special liturgical celebration.

It was a joint collaboration of the MSFS confreres of Jalna community, the SJSM sisters, the teaching and service staff of St. Mary's School and the faithful of St. Mary's Church, Jalna that the celebration could be successfully carried out.
